PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE

There is one thing that we as members of the Iris Society owe to each other and the public in general. This is the exchange of information on cultural prac-

tices and procedures. Our own experience can save trial and disappointment in the practices of others.

We could hold educational sessions to inform outsiders of iris culture, but most of us shy away from formal sessions. Those who visit members' gardens do learn by looking and asking questions, and this should be encouraged. We already extend an open invitation to membership in the society as a means of expanding a person's knowledge. The information people seek should be readily available. We do have the responsibility of sharing and bringing out information. What has helped us personally in the garden can be shared with others.

The expansion of quarterly "NEWS and VIEWS" is more than an attempt to attract members. It is a chance to compare practices among ourselves. Not one member has a garden free from disease, weeds, or plants that could be helped. Seasonal variation, causal organisms, and nutritional behavior in irises is not as well understood as we would like.

The understanding of iris progress by those who should know (at the University, and in the Horticulture Society) is not up to par; but instead of blaming those who do not know, we have the responsibility to see that they are informed, kept up to date, and guided in the progress of the iris.

This is still education, but a gentle form that can help us as we help others.
