Species Iris (Juno)

The Juno iris are very different from the usual types we are accustomed to. They have broad channeled foliege resembling miniature cornstalks. The strikingly colored blooms spring from the leaf axils and usually have from six to nine blossoms on each stalk, ranging in color from white to yellow and blus. Their season of bloom is extremely early and they sometimes get nipped by frost unless protected after the buds form. The bulbs look like hemerocallis or dahliz roots and are very brittle so they must be handled carefully. The height of the bloomstalks vary from 6 to 15 inches. Juno iris prefer a light well drained soil and they require no special growing instructions that I know of. Plant them in the Fall.

Camera Tip

Where the background is undesirable and it is impossible to get a backdrop for a picture, try this method. Use a lens opening of f 3.5 or f 4. and focus very carefully. This will blur out the background by cutting down the depth of the picture that is in focus. Of course you will not need as much time for exposure either because of the larger lens opening = 1/100 of a second or there about.
