We noticed there is only one red iris, RAMGER, unless you classify MULBERRY ROSE as a red. There are two bicolors, white with yellow, PINNACLE and HYSTIC HEL-ODY, two bicolors, white with purple or blue, old reliable WABASH and the nower HELEN COLLINGWOOD; two yellows with a definite green influence, CHARMAIZE and LIME-LIGHT; and notice how many new brown irises are listed; ARGUS PHEASANT, ERYCE CAN-YON, SUNSET BLAZE, THOTHES III, GOLDEN RUSSET, GYPSY CLASSIC, and INCA CHIEF, this is an indication of a great improvement in brown irises. There were only three in the violet or purple group, SABLE, SABLE MIGHT and VIOLET HARMONY. Only three pliccatas received three or more votes, HINNIE COLQUITT, BLUE SHIDMER and FIREDANCE. interestingly enough, each is in a different color group. The newer pink iris are exceedingly popular, the tops in the cameo or baby ribbon pinks are; HAPPY BIRTHDAY CHERIE, PINK FORMAL, PARTY DRESS, PINK CAMEO and PINK SENSATION. MARY RANDALL is the only deeper rose pink, and there are two in the apricot or peach pink class, PALCHINO and TOP FLIGHT, RADIATION is the only lavender pink listed. All these pink irises have tangerine beards. Four creams were listed; STARSHINE, AMANDINE, BELL-ERIVE and DESERT SONG. With the exception of LADY ILSE, which is quite new, the blue iris on the list are generally older varieties, they are CHIVALRY, BLUE RHYTHM, JANE PHILLIPS, DANUBE WAVE, MISSOURI, PIERRE HENARD and SKY RANGER in medium tones of blue and SYLVIA MURRAY and CAHOKIA in lighter tones of blue as is LADY ILSE. Seven white iris are included in the list, NEW SNOW, SNOW FLURRY, TRANQUILITY, CLIFFS OF DOVER, GUDRUM, SMO! CARNIVAL and WINTER CARNIVAL, all of which are quite well known in our area. Only three golden yellows which is surprising considering the garden value of this color, were voted on, they are OLA KALA, CLOTHOF GOLD and SOLID GOLD. CASCADE SPLENDOR and CHANTILLY were the only "soft" blends selected, and ORMOHR, ELMOHR and LADY MOHR were the choices in the enco class. The iris that received the greatest number of votes was TRULY YOURS, a very lovely yellow and creamy white combination.
